

Addition and Subtraction

For quick addition, use the "rounding up" method. For example, to add $23 + 18$, round up 23 to 25 and subtract 5 from the answer. So, $25 + 18 - 5 = 38$. For subtraction, employ the "counting up" method. To subtract 15 from 37, count up from 15 to 37 (16, 17, 18, 19, 20, 21, 22). The answer is 22.

Multiplication

Multiplying numbers can be tricky, but here's a fun way to do it. For instance, to multiply 12×8 , break down 12 into $10 + 2$. Then multiply $10 \times 8 = 80$ and $2 \times 8 = 16$. Add them up: $80 + 16 = 96$. For easier multiplication of larger numbers, use the "Russian peasant" method. Simply double one number and halve the other until you get to 1. Then multiply the halved numbers corresponding to the doubled numbers. Let's try 14×15 :

- 14×15
- 7×30
- 3×60
- $1 \times 120 = 120$

Division

Divide by 5 using the "divide by 10 and multiply by 2" trick. To divide 25 by 5, divide 25 by 10 (2.5) and multiply by 2 (5). For dividing by 10, simply move the decimal point one place to the left. Divide 98 by 10 by moving the decimal point: 9.8.


Fun Math Tricks




